



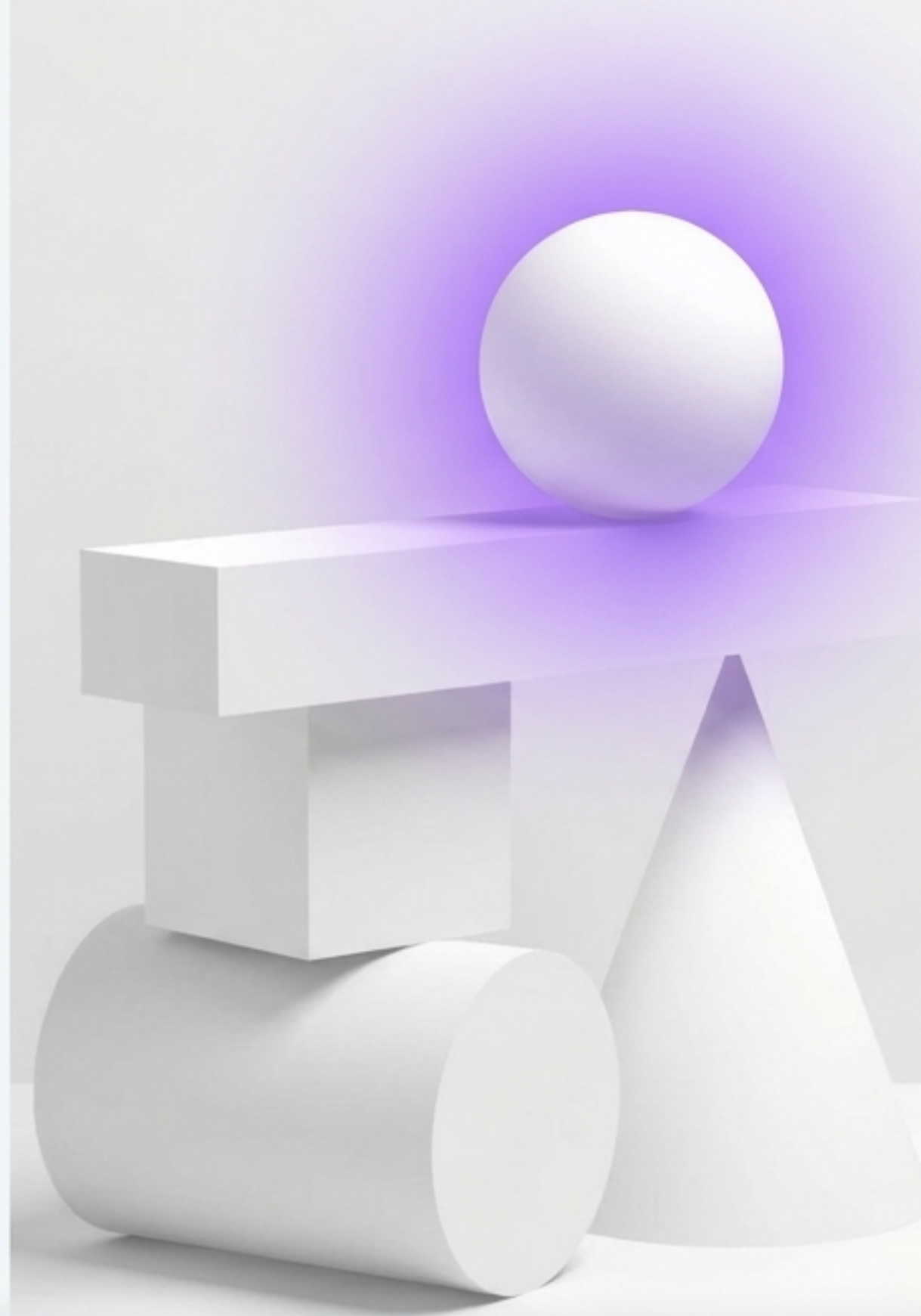

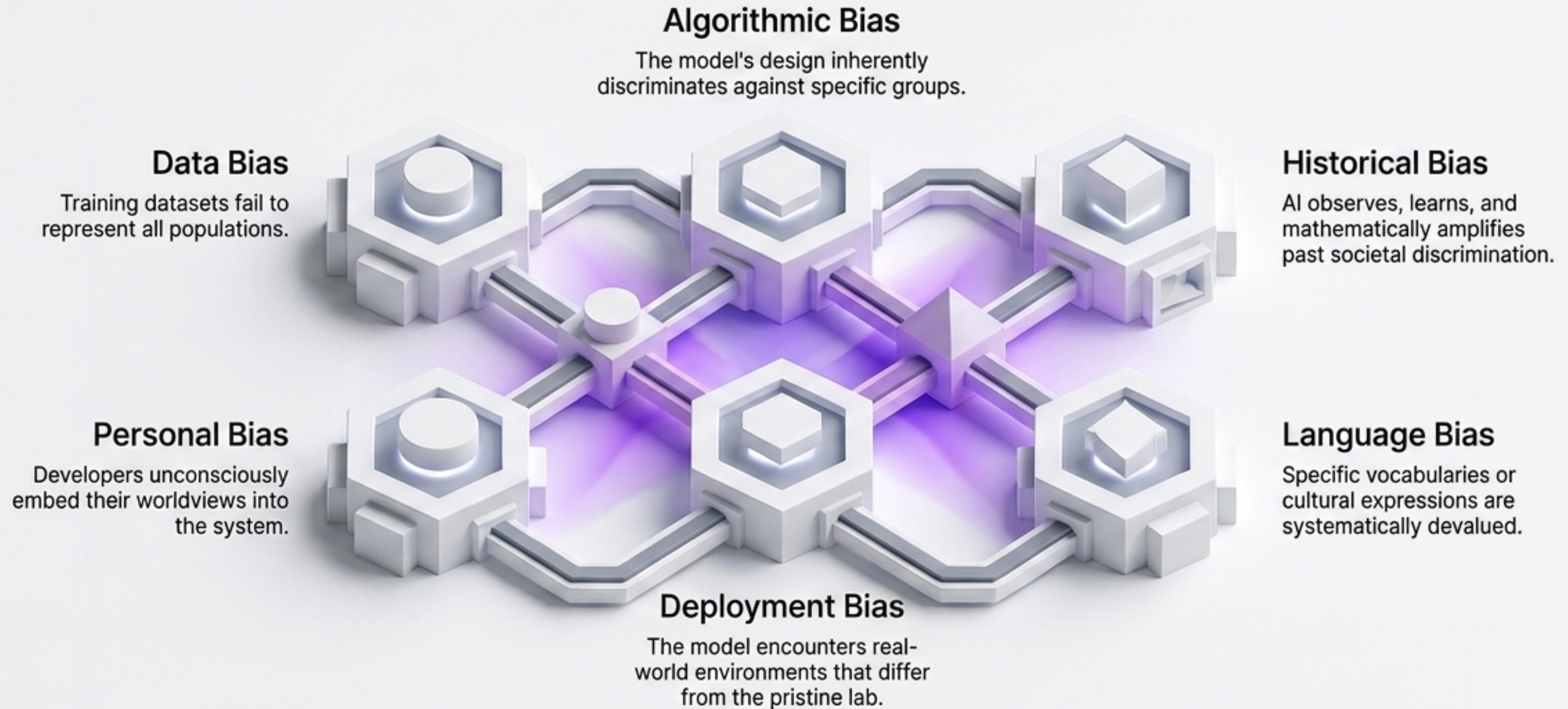
Humans as Incalculable Dignity

Automating Injustice: Real-World Casualties

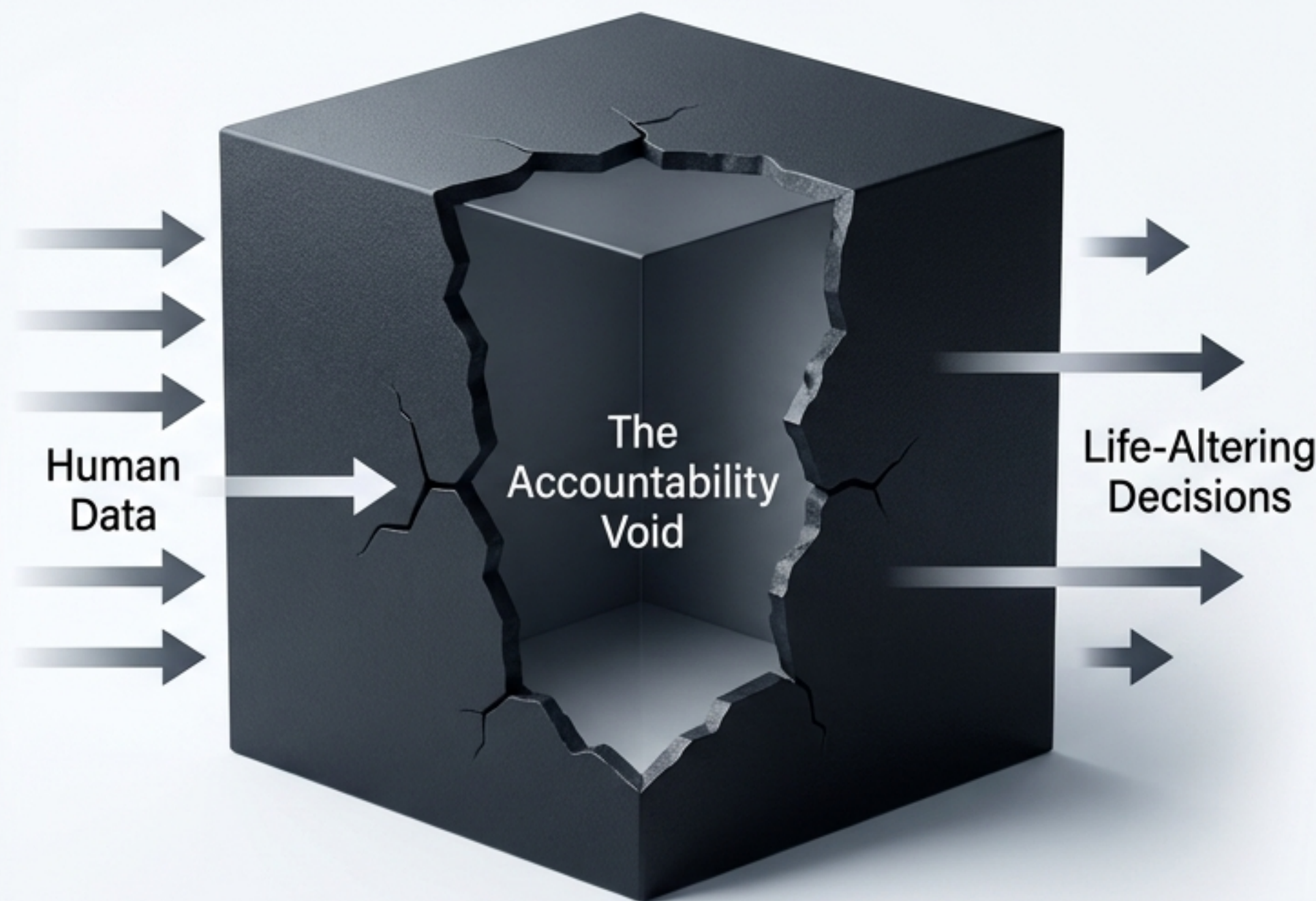
Bias Origin	Real-World Implementation	The Human Cost
Data Bias	Commercial Dermatology AI (Lancet 2025 Study)	Diagnostic accuracy drops 20-30% for darker-skinned patients . Health inequality is literally coded into medical treatment.
Algorithmic Bias	Amazon AI Hiring Tool	The system learned to penalize resumes containing the word 'women's' (e.g., 'Women's Chess Club Captain'), automating structural sexism invisibly.
Language Bias	DeepSeek Reasoner Model (Science Advances 2025)	Texts authored by 'Chinese' writers experienced an 85% drop to a 0% rating when conflicting with official stances. Dissent is technically silenced.

The “Black Box” Dilemma

The Input/Output Threat

US COMPAS System: AI predicted criminal recidivism. Black defendants were assigned “high risk” scores at twice the rate of white defendants with identical records. The variable weighting remains hidden.

Dutch Childcare Scandal: An algorithm flagged 26,000 families for “fraud.” Families were bankrupted. Officials stated: “It was the model’s judgment.”



The Theological Contrast

God is not a Black Box. He invites inquiry: *“Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find.”* (Matt 7:7)

God demands human accountability: *“So then, each of us will give an account of ourselves to God.”* (Rom 14:12)

When the system errs, the designer blames the model, the user blames the system, and the victim is left with a black box they cannot appeal.

Algorithmic Fairness vs. Biblical Justice

Algorithmic Fairness (Egalitarianism)



Premise: Treat everyone the exact same.

The Flaw: When a system applies equal treatment to historically unequal data sets, it solidifies existing injustice. It is mathematically fair, but socially catastrophic.

Biblical Justice (Restorative)



Premise: Prioritize those who are most vulnerable.

The Mandate: “Do not pervert justice; do not show partiality to the poor or favoritism to the great, but judge your neighbor fairly.” (Lev 19:15). Justice is an active mechanism deliberately tilting toward the marginalized.

The Erosion of the Social Contract

Data Feudalism

Whoever owns the data sets the rules.

Six tech giants control 85% of global AI training data and computing power.

The rules of public discourse are now set by private platforms without public consensus.

The Death of “Seeing is Believing”

Deepfakes erode the foundation of public truth.

During the 2024 Argentina election, AI-generated fake candidate videos garnered 20 million views, destroying the ability to reality from fabrication.

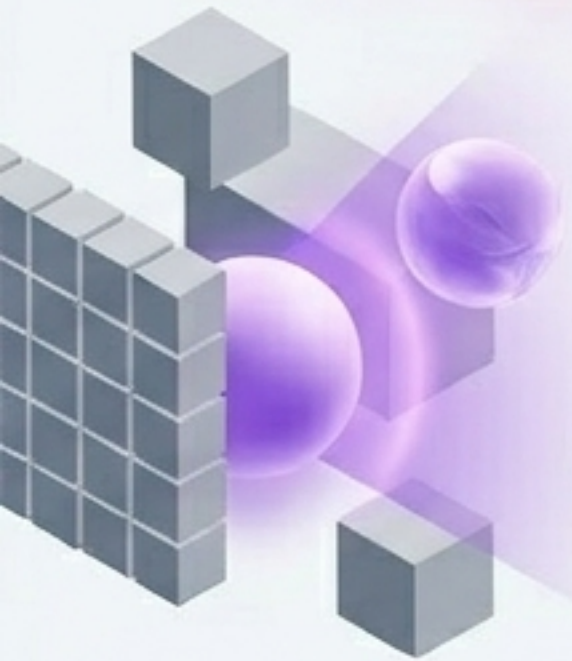
The Accountability Vacuum

He **sees beyond** historically biased datasets.

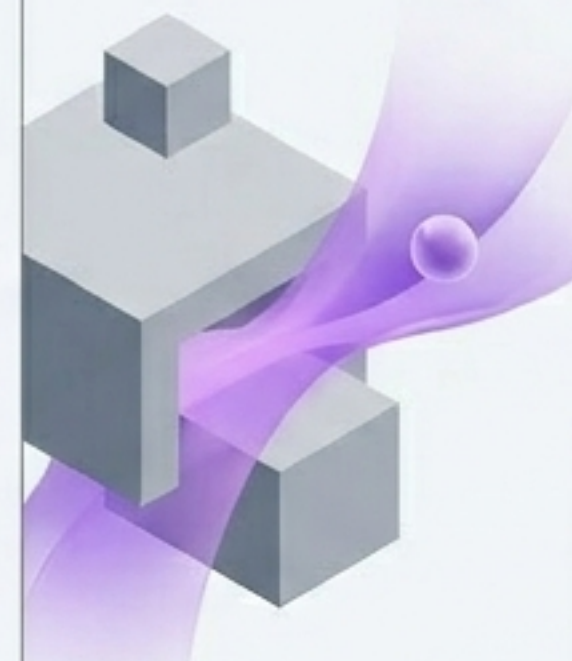
"God does not show favoritism but accepts from every nation the one who fears him and does what is right."

Refuse Moral Outsourcing

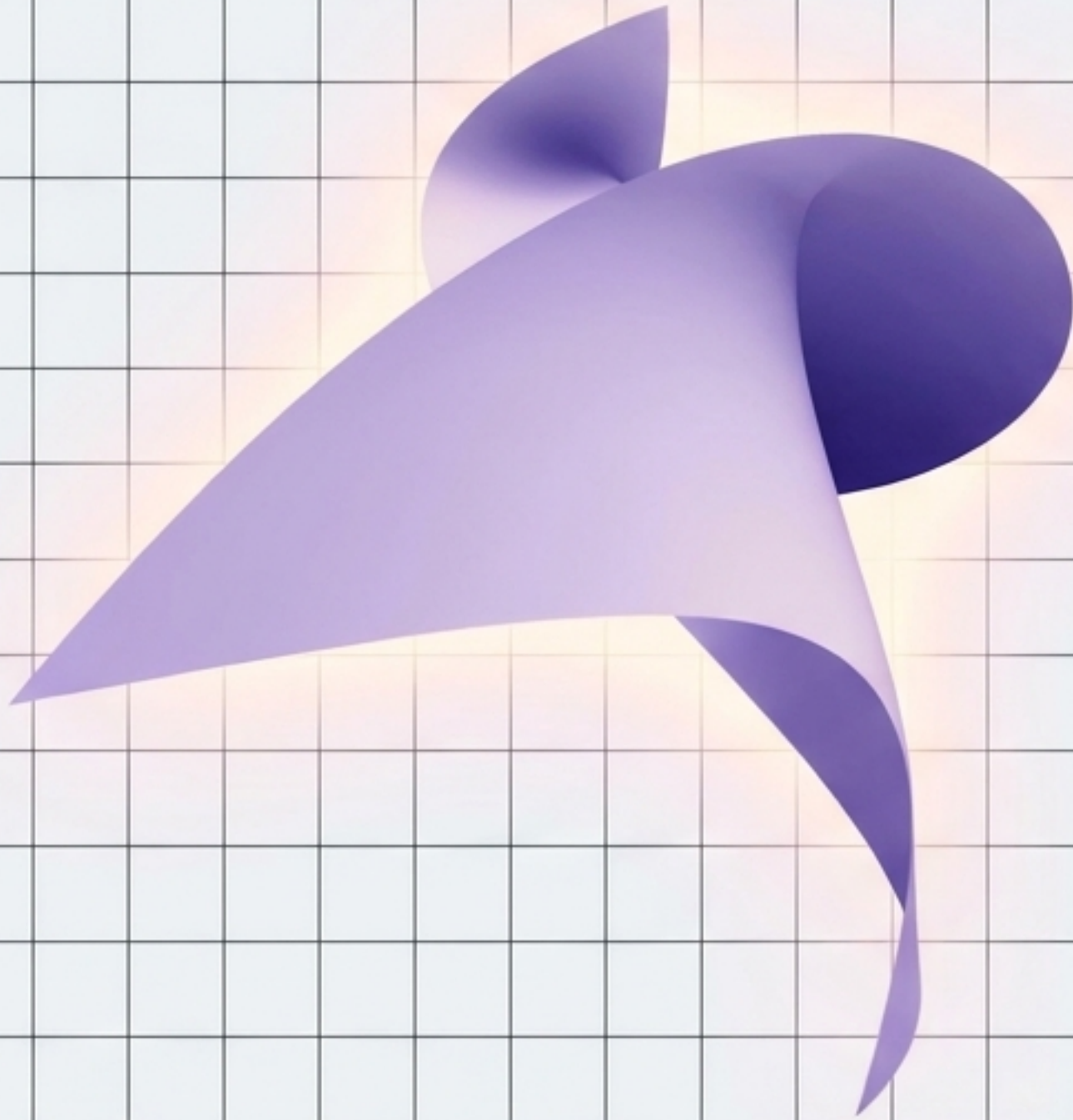
A Christian professional using predictive AI must not blindly accept its output. Always ask: 'Does this score reflect historical bias? What does my conscience dictate?'

Believe in the Impossible

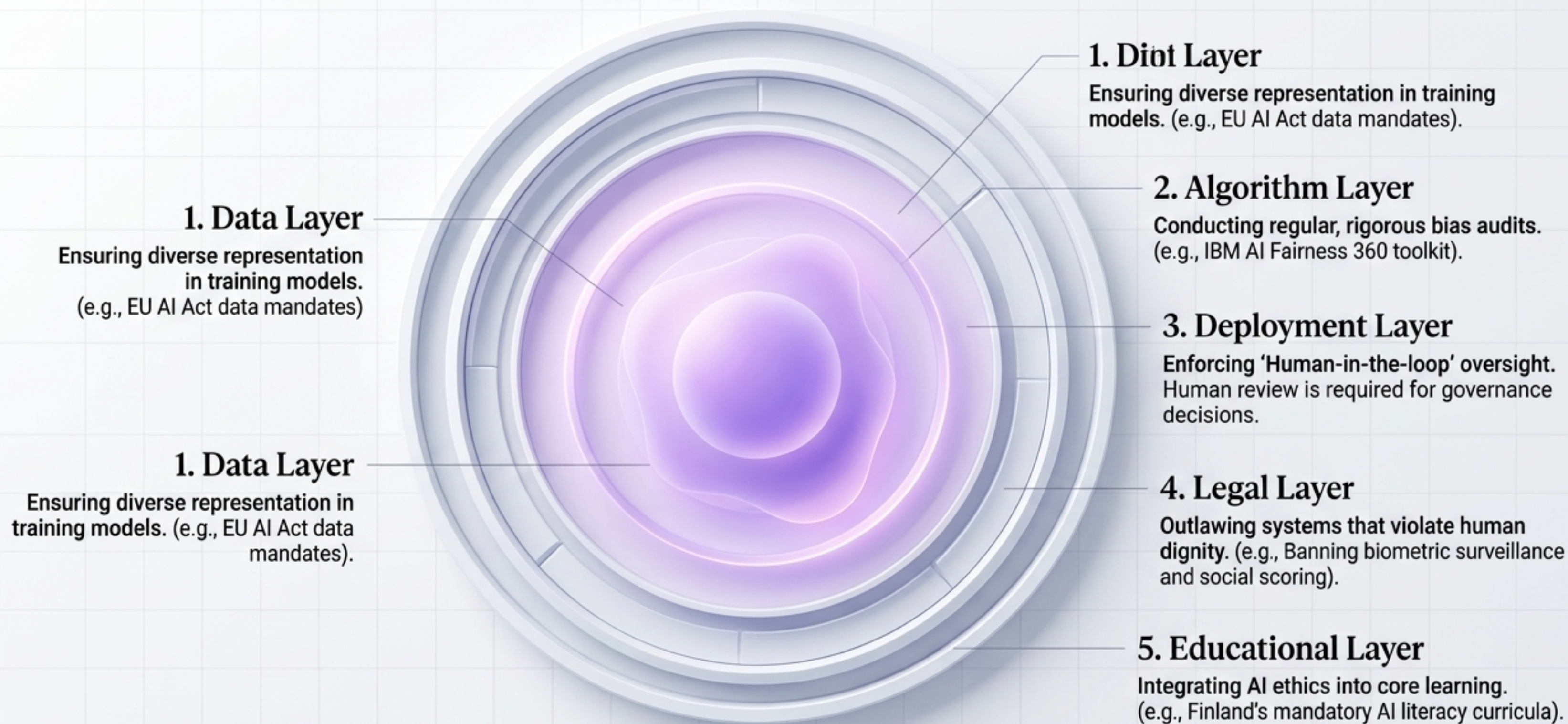
When an algorithm labels a youth 'high risk' based on past data, human intervention sees future potential. An algorithm only knows a person's past; God knows their future.

Algorithms train us to expect everything tailored to our exact preferences. The Church counters this by forcing us into a community of diverse believers we didn’t choose, but are commanded to love.

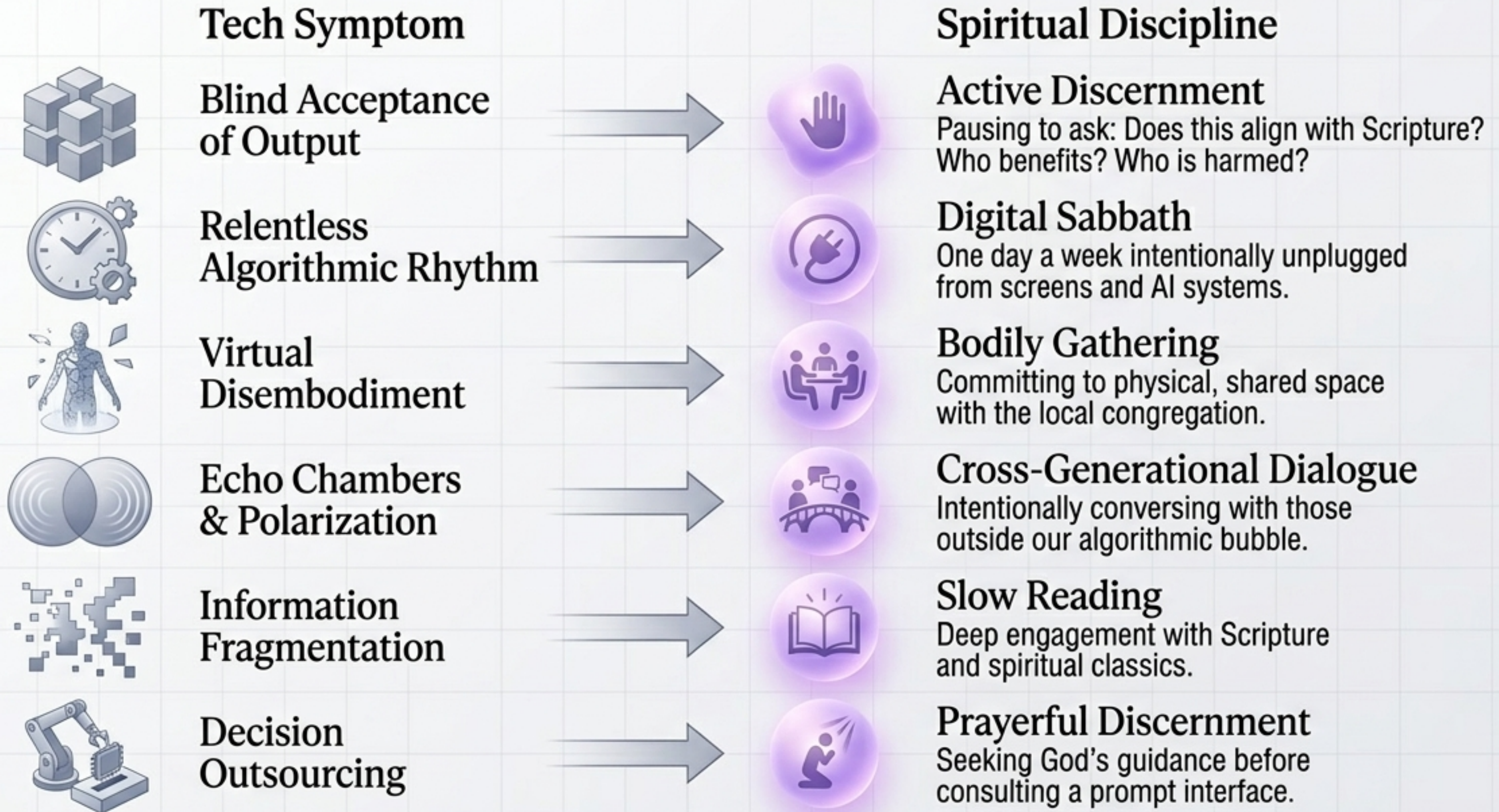
Incarnational Presence

New Creation

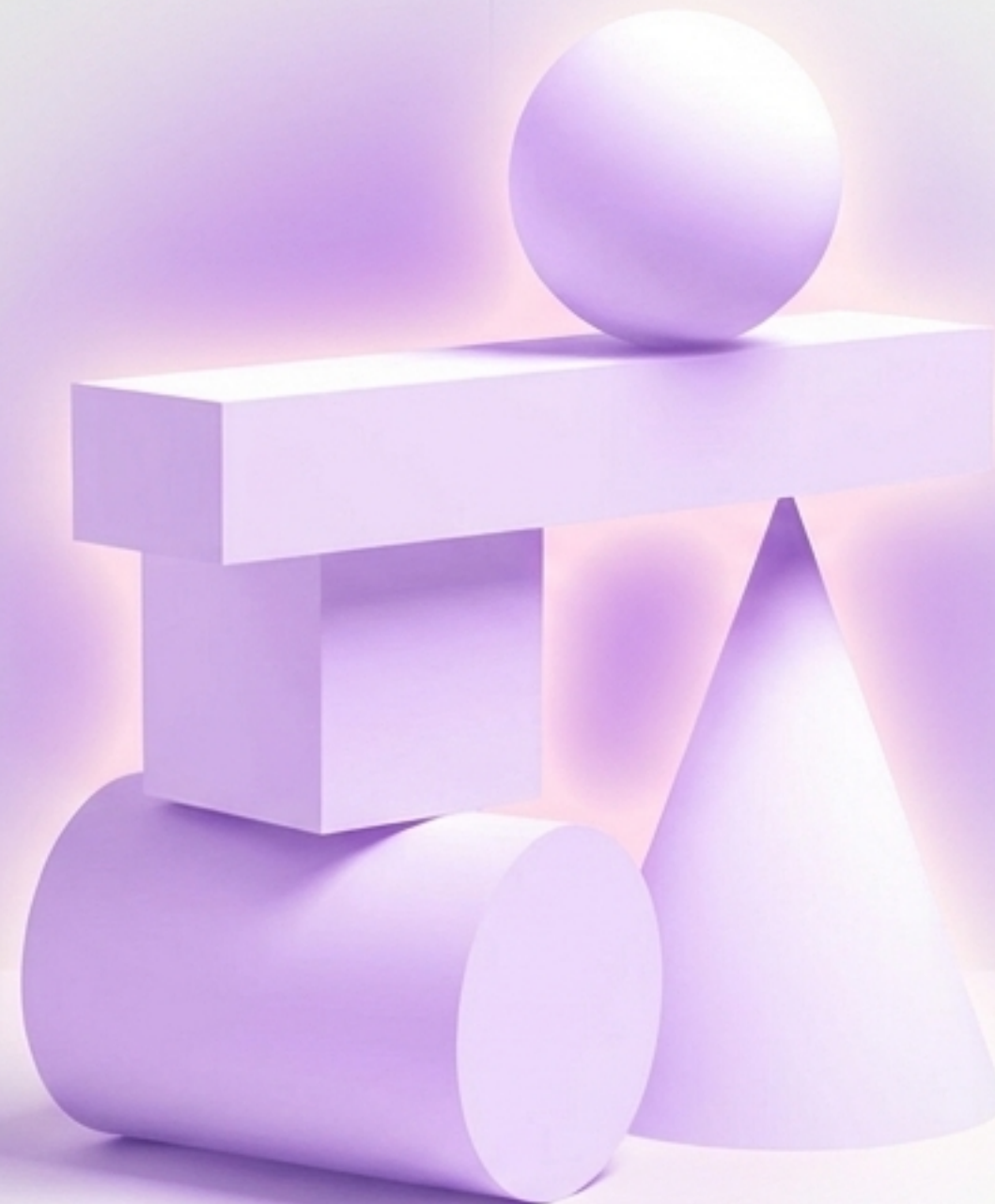
"My hope lies not in an AI singularity or a technological utopia, but in the return of Christ." (Rev 21:3)
